EPA Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaking (TCGM) Program


- Purpose: Reduce barriers and make it easier for small, community-based organizations to access federal environmental justice funds.
- \$600 million from Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the largest investment in climate action in history.
- 11 grantmakers covering all EPA regions to distribute thousands of grants over 3 years.





GHHI's Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program

- \$40 million in grants to approximately 171 eligible environmental justice grant projects benefitting disadvantaged communities in EPA's Region 3
- Program staff and TA Provider
 partners with subject matter
 expertise to support applicants and
 grantees

Grantmaking Focus: Possible EJ Issues

- Air quality & asthma
- Fence line air quality monitoring
- Monitoring of effluent discharges from industrial facilities
- Water quality & sampling
- Small cleanup projects
- Improving food access to reduce vehicle miles traveled
- Stormwater issues and green infrastructure
- Lead and asbestos contamination.
- Pesticides and other toxic substances

- Healthy homes that are energy/water use efficient and not subject to indoor air pollution
- Illegal dumping activities, such as education, outreach, and small-scale clean-ups
- Emergency preparedness and disaster resiliency
- Environmental job training for occupations that reduce greenhouse gases and other air pollutants
- Environmental justice training for youth

Noncompetitive Grants: 1 year, \$75,000

- Expected to be 10 noncompetitive awards for <u>severely</u> capacity constrained entities
- Criteria and selection process will be developed by GHHI and the Advisory Board
- Not managed through this RFA process

Eligible Applicants (must be in EPA Region 3)

- Nonprofit organizations
- Tribal governments (both federally and state recognized) and intertribal consortia
- Native American organizations (includes Indian groups, cooperatives, nonprofit corp., partnerships, and associations)
- Local governments
- Institutions of higher education

Application Materials

Vision: Transparent, low-barrier application, with optional templates and limited questions.

- Online platform for submissions (preferred) or mail-in option.
- Expectation is that the application can be completed in 4 to 8 hours, including up to an hour for the budget and up to an hour for the work plan.
- Supports for applicants throughout the process



Application Materials

Narrative Proposal

Community need, proposed project, organizational capacity & TA needs, project evaluation process. (No more than 7 pages)

Budget

Optional template will be provided.

Work Plan

Optional template will be provided.

Financial Statement

Most recent statement. Tier I applicants without a financial statement can submit a document explaining how the project will be financially managed.

A-133 Audit

Most recent A-133 audit, if applicable.

2 to 3 minute video about the project or highlighting the need for the project

Welcome

The EPA's Environmental Justice Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program provides one and two-year grants to community-based non-profits and other eligible subrecipients for assessment, planning, and project development activities that advance environmental justice. The program is intended to make it easier for small community-based organizations and their partners to access federal environmental justice funding and to improve the efficiency of the awards process so that communities that have long faced underinvestment and the burdens of environmental injustices can access the benefits of the largest climate investment in history. Thriving Communities grants will be coupled with technical assistance to support grantees in organizational capacity building and advancing their environmental justice activities.

Green & Healthy Homes Initiative (GHHI), a Baltimore-based non-profit organization focused on environmental justice, racial equity, and the social determinants of health is the Region 3 Thriving Communities Grantmaker. An external Advisory Board provides guidance to GHHI in the direction and management of the Region 3 Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program.



Inflation Reduction Act Disadvantaged Communities Map

The <u>Environmental and Climate Justice Program (ECJ Program)</u>, created by the <u>Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)</u>, provides funding for financial and technical assistance to carry out environmental and climate justice activities to benefit disadvantaged communities.

map to assist potential applicants seeking to identify whether a community is disadvantaged for the purposes of implementing the ECJ Program.

The EPA IRA Disadvantaged Communities maps combines multiple datasets that individually can be used to determine whether a community is disadvantaged for the purposes of implementing programs under the IRA. All data sets are assigned values at the Census block group level.
